1964 published just two novels and three short stories in her lifetime but achieved lasting literary acclaim her classic novel quicksand first appeared in 1928 lylin is not used to being alone much less alone hurt and lost so when she is separated from her guard and forced to abandon her horse she counts herself lucky to stumble upon a manor house still frightened by those who chased her into the night she keeps her identity a secret calling herself lily as she accepts the help of kind servants and the compassion of lord fallon when they fall into an easy friendship she wonders if her secrecy was too hasty however as she gets to know the manor and its residents lylin discovers that she is not the only one hiding secrets and it may be a very good thing that her host doesn't know her true identity as a member of the royal family from p 4 cover from the bc doctor who has become a household name for leading the response to the pandemic a personal account of the first weeks of covid for readers of sam nutt's damned nations and james maskayk's life on the ground floor dr bonnie henry has been called one of the most effective public health figures in the world by the new york times she has been called a calming voice in a sea of

coronavirus madness and our hero in national newspapers but in the waning days of 2019 when the first rumours of a strange respiratory ailment in wuhan china began to trickle into her office in british columbia these accolades lay in a barely imaginable future only weeks later the whole world would look back on the previous year with the kind of nostalgia usually reserved for the distant past with a staggering suddenness our livelihoods our closest relationships our habits and our homes had all been transformed in a moment when half truths threatened to drown out the truth when recklessness all too often exposed those around us to very real danger and when it was difficult to tell paranoia from healthy respect for an invisible threat dr henry's transparency humility and humanity became a beacon for millions of canadians and her trademark enjoinder to be kind be calm and be safe became words for us all to live by coincidentally dr henry's sister lynn arrived in bc for a long planned visit on march 12 just as the virus revealed itself as a pandemic for the four ensuing weeks lynn had rare insight into the whirlwind of bonnie's daily life with its moments of agony and gravity as well as its

occasional episodes of levity and grace both a global story and a family story be kind be calm be safe combines lynn s observations and knowledge of bonnie s personal and professional background with bonnie s recollections of how and why decisions were made to tell in a vivid way the dramatic tale of the four weeks that changed all our lives be kind be calm be safe is about communication leadership and public trust about the balance between politics and policy and at heart about what and who we value as individuals and a society the authors advance from the publisher has been donated to charities with a focus on alleviating communities hit particularly hard by the pandemic true north aid with its covid 19 response in northern indigenous communities and first book canada with its focus on reading and literacy for underserved marginalized youth teva s life seems normal school friends boyfriend but at home she hides an impossible secret eleven other tevas because once a year teva separates into two leaving a younger version of herself stuck at the same age in the same house watching the new teva live the life that she d been living but as her seventeenth birthday rolls around teva is determined not to let it happen again she s going to fight for her future even if that means fighting herself nella larsen 1891 1964 occupies a central place in african american and modernist literature and her status as a harlem renaissance woman writer is rivaled only by zora neale hurston s this norton critical edition of larsen s

electrifying 1929 novel is accompanied by carla kaplan s insightfully detailed introduction explanatory annotations and a note on the text backgrounds and contexts connects passing to the historical events of the day most notably the sensational rhinelander jones case of 1925 fourteen contemporary reviews are reprinted including those by alice dunbar nelson w b seabrook mary griffin and w e b du bois little known documents including those by juanita ellsworth and caleb johnson reveal america s fascination with and fear of the cultural phenomenon of passing also included are larsen s statements on the novel and on passing as well as a generous selection of her letters the theme of the tragic mulatto a in american literature is explored through related writings by lydia maria child william wells brown kate chopin mark twain countee cullen and langston hughes among others finally joseph seamon cotter jr jessie redmon fauset countee cullen w e b du bois allen semi nella larsen george s schuyler carl van vechten and langston hughes voice their impressions of passing from the perspective of the harlem renaissance criticism provides sixteen diverse interpretations of passing by among others deborah e mcdowell judith butler cheryl a wall thadious m davis george hutchinson mary helen washington ann ducille gayle wald claudia tate and jennifer devere brody a chronology and selected bibliography are also included book jacket bittersweet perfection guardian best books of the year an engulfing historical novel the times

control if violet s mom can t pick a decent man herself they will help her snag george clooney in dear george clooney please marry my mom susin nielsen has created a truly original protagonist in violet and a brilliant new novel that will delight readers into rooting for her even when she s at her worst in their present day tourist trap of an irish seaside town famed for its supposed involvement with selkies in the past three sisters are faced with the sudden disappearance of their mother crushed by the loss their father is struggling to carry on to make matters worse there are rumors afloat in the village that their mother herself is a selkie who has now shed her human form and gone back to sea as cordie sullivan the oldest daughter tries to learn more about her mother s vanishing she must find the strength to help her family move ahead even as she discovers an increasing number of clues that point to a hidden island off the coast a mythical kingdom of the selkies this retelling of a beloved fairy tale finds 15 year old ella discovering that accepting the prince s proposal ensnares her in a suffocating tangle of palace rules and royal etiquette felix knutsson is nearly thirteen lives with his mother and pet gerbil horatio and is brilliant at memorising facts and trivia so far pretty normal but felix and his mom astrid have a secret they are living in a van astrid promises it s only for a while until she finds a new job and begs felix not to breathe a word about it so when felix starts at a new school he does his very best to hide the fact that most of his

clothes are in storage he only showers weekly at the community centre and that he doesn't have enough to eat when his friends Dylan and Winnie ask to visit Felix always has an excuse but Felix has a plan to turn his and Astrid's lives around he's going to go on his favourite game show who what where when and win the cash prize all he needs is a little luck and a lot of brain power Susin Nielsen deftly combines humour heartbreak and hope in this moving story about people who slip through the cracks in society and about the power of friendship and community to make all the difference discusses the best methods of learning describing how rereading and rote repetition are counterproductive and how such techniques as self-testing spaced retrieval and finding additional layers of information in new material can enhance learning for fifteen-year-old Rosetta Wolff the war in Europe seems very far off from her home in Canada then Mr Schwartzberg comes to tea and asks Rosetta's parents if they will take in a young war refugee Isaac joins the family and becomes a ready-made brother to Rosetta and her two sisters Isaac's arrival brings change her best friend's handsome brother doesn't seem as attractive after he reveals himself as anti-Semitic and Rosetta begins to suspect her friend may agree with him as Rosetta and Isaac become friends and he shares his story with her she helps him learn the fate of other family members and helps him shape a promising future in his new country mindfulness and acceptance based

approaches such as acceptance and commitment therapy ACT and mindfulness acceptance commitment therapy (ACT) are gaining momentum with sport psychology practitioners who work to support elite athletes these acceptance-based or third-wave cognitive behavioral approaches in sport psychology highlight that thought suppression and control techniques can trigger a metacognitive scanning process and that excessive cognitive activity and task-irrelevant focus self-focused attention such as trying to change thoughts disrupts performance using this perspective the aim of sport psychology interventions is not to help the athletes engage in the futile task of managing and controlling internal life rather it suggests that sport psychology practitioners should work to increase athletes' willingness to accept negative thoughts and emotions in pursuit of valued ends key aspects of such interventions include teaching athletes to open up and accept teaching athletes to mindfully engage in the present moment and helping athletes formulate the values and engage in committed actions towards these values the goal of mindfulness and acceptance in sport is to help athletes perform and thrive under pressure then is to provide students researchers practitioners and coaches of sport psychology with practical guidance for implementing mindfulness and acceptance approaches in their work with athletes this book brings together highly experienced practitioners and shares their working methods

crush and a mortifyingly bad haircut and it's looking like jo will be lucky to make it out of the year alive when you're a pizza faced dork who uses wikipedia as a diary and would rather wear ancient hand me downs than shop at the mall what's the upside jo is about to find it in the most unlikely way thirteen year old wrestling fanatic henry used to have a normal life now his therapist wants him to keep a journal so he can express his feelings about what happened henry has moved with his dad to a new city where nobody knows their name he lives off a diet of pizza whilst hiding from the comically overbearing neighbours and avoiding being an obvious target for bullies at his new school but then he meets farley and alberta social misfits who refuse to let him be alone and bit by bit the past begins to come out heartbreaking surprising and laugh out loud funny the reluctant journal of henry k larsen is about the things that remain after your life has fallen to pieces jonathan is the only half angel and half demon in the world having discovered his heritage he must now continue the battle against the demonic forces that are hellbent on ruling creation the archdemon baal is one such monster and he holds jonathan's parents captive but to succeed baal needs the wings of an archangel jonathan and his great aunt sammael are the only two such angels left but they aren't going to give up their wings without a fight jonathan will not rest until his family is safe once again even if he must go through heaven and hell to save them the bestselling
